Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“...O you of little faith.” There aren’t many phrases in the Bible that feel like a punch to the gut quite like this one. To be called out by Jesus for a lack of faith is a terrible thought for most of us. In fact, we would likely react in a Peter-like denial if someone suggested our faith were lacking. But when you read today’s Gospel, you really can’t deny it. We worry. A lot. We worry about what we will eat and where we will live. We worry about caring for ourselves and our families. We work and toil our lives away, trying to meet all of our “needs”. Jesus tells us that if we had any faith in God, we wouldn’t worry about anything. He tells us that if God provides for the birds and the plants then surely he will also provide for us. That message is not a new one, either. In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah also reminds us that a mother could more easily forget her newborn infant than God could forget about us. So have faith!! As stewards, we are called to be faithful to God. As stewards, we are expected to be grateful for what he provides. As stewards, we must share all He has given us. Therefore, worry is for the insatiable, not for the faithful.

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE REGULATIONS

Ash Wednesday & Good Friday are days of FASTING

Catholics, from the **18th birthday** up to the **59th birthday** (the beginning of the 60th year) are obliged to fast, that is, take only one full meal and two lesser meals, with nothing to eat in between meals. Drinking fluids would not be contrary to the practice of fasting.

Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent, including Good Friday, are days of ABSTAINING from meat.

All Catholics, beginning with the **14th birthday**, are obliged to abstain from eating meat.

People who are unable to practice bodily penance, due to pregnancy, illness, or hard physical labor may choose another form of penance or charity. The Church urges that works of penance be linked to works of charity – for example, using the money saved on less expensive meals or giving up snacks to feed the poor.

St. Patrick's 3 and 4 year old preschool and prekindergarten

are now enrolling for the 2017-2018 school year. Students must be 3 or 4 years old by August 31st and must be toilet trained. There is a limit of 12 spaces in the 3 year old program and 16 spaces in the 4 year old program. These spaces will be filled on a first come first served basis. Tuition for the 3 year old program is \$50.00 a month, there is no tuition for the 4 year old program due to a grant that covers the costs. There is a \$100 enrollment fee for both classes.
