

Fifth Sunday of Lent

With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption. Psalm 130 captures the theme of today’s readings. The first reading from the prophet Ezekiel foretells the day of resurrection for the Israelites. Paul’s letter to the Romans explains that as Christian stewards, we must not live in the flesh, but in the Spirit of God, who has redeemed us. And finally, in the Gospel of John, we have the vivid retelling of the raising of Lazarus. In all of today’s readings, we are reminded that God has the power to overcome sin and death and raise us out of the grave. Our bodies are plagued by sin, but like Lazarus, we have hope that God will call each of us by name, beckoning us into eternal life with Him. We must be grateful for His grace and for the hope it provides, and we must live a life that is deserving of such redemption.

Rwandan Genocide Survivor to Bring Message of Forgiveness and Hope

In 1994, members of the Hutu tribe in Rwanda took up arms against the Tutsi tribe. In only 100 days, the Hutu tribe slaughtered over 800,000 Tutsis using only spears, clubs and machetes. It was genocide, and few Tutsis survived. Immaculee Ilibagiza was one of the few, and almost all of her family and friends were killed. Immaculee will bring her message of faith and forgiveness through a retreat to The Church of the Blessed Sacrament, 124 N. Every Friday is a day of Penance

All members of the Christian faithful in their own way are bound to do penance in virtue of divine law; in order that all may be joined in a common observance of penance, penitential days are prescribed in which the Christian faithful in a special way pray, exercise works of piety and charity, and deny themselves by fulfilling their responsibilities more faithfully and especially by observing fast and abstinence according to the norm of the following canons.

All Fridays through the year and the time of Lent are penitential days and times throughout the universal Church.

Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the conference of bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.



It is Jesus himself who invites us to make room in our hearts for the urgency to “feed the hungry”, and the Church has made it one of the corporal works of mercy. To share what we have with those who lack the means to satisfy such a primary need, educates us in that charity that is an overflowing gift of passion for the life of the poor that the Lord makes us meet.”
