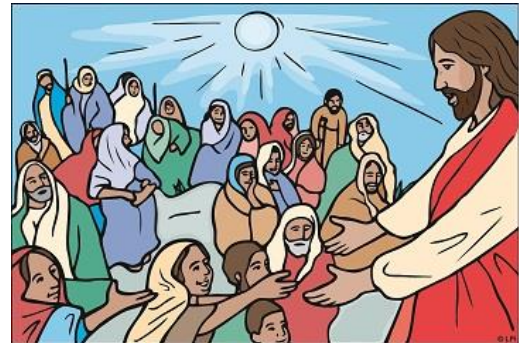

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our gospel today causes us to pause and consider the word "blessed." We are given four "blessed are you" statements balanced by four "woe to you" statements. Generally speaking, most of us would prefer to be "blessed" rather than in a state of "woe," but as usual, Jesus wants to challenge our general ideas. Jesus says blessed are those who are poor, hungry, weeping, and hated by others; He says woe to you who are rich, full, laughing, and loved by all. This is the exact opposite of what we might think -- why would He say that? The answer seems fairly obvious: woe to you who are attached to this world, for you have already received your happiness. In discipleship, Jesus is calling us out of the comforts of this world, and blessed are they who respond! A good steward gratefully responds to Jesus, putting our worldly needs aside and using our gifts, our blessings, to meet the needs of others. Also, challenging ourselves to reach for a higher purpose than the pleasures of this life. Clearly God has blessed us abundantly, and for that we should be grateful and fully alive in Christ.
